This is a special year for the Charleston Historical Society! Twenty years ago a small group of dedicated volunteers made their dream of keeping the history of Charleston alive for the present and future generations! They formed the CHS. Through hard work and determination they obtained the old West Village Schoolhouse as a Museum for displaying the many artifacts and items that have been donated.

Thanks to our Founders and the generous donations and support of members and friends we have come a long way -- and have accomplished much!

This year of economic uncertainty, we are all tightening our budgets and making wise use of our money. We wish to thank everyone for your continuing membership and support. The CHS greatly appreciates that you value its work and will continue to collect, protect, display, explore and share the history of Charleston.

Please note that the membership fee has not changed since our inception. The reason for this is, even though the individual membership is still only \$3.00, most choose to donate more!

Last year was an active one. There was an increase in visitations to the Museum, not only on Wednesdays but also by appointment. On several occasions our historians provided informal tours to interested students, visitors and descendants of earlier settlers.

There has been discussion of obtaining a chair lift. More research and estimations will be conducted as we do wish the Museum to be more easily accessible.

The Cupola project is uppermost on our agenda for this year. The goal is that it will be completed and at its new home this summer. The Site Committee is working on this.

We will again conduct a Yard Sale. It is unsure how long we will continue doing this, but the income generated helps with the general expenses.

The sale of Cemetery catalogs and Newsclipping books has been good. (The positive responses received from the first Newsclipping book has encouraged me to complete two more!)

The CHS continues to seek Town historical articles of interest, family genealogies, family stories, photos, obituaries, etc. to place on display at the Museum. Does anyone have a photo of the old Town Clerk's Office (the cement block building?) School houses, class or sports photos? Charleston Post Cards? Max Party photos? Farm or business photos and memorabilia? Organizations, like the Fire Dept. Modern Woodman, Women's clubs, 4-H, Scouts etc?

Volunteers are needed in May for our annual cleaning bee - getting the Museum ready for company - the more the merrier - and we really are merry!

Also volunteers are needed at the Yard Sale, both in preparing for the sale, the sale, and clean up after. We have a jolly good time! Won't you join us?

Volunteers are also needed for Museum hours and functions. I have made new friends and met old school chums through my volunteering - I think you would enjoy it too!
